Nahyan opens French Church in Abu Dhabi

Abu Dhabi, 24 Oct. 2009 (WAM) - The United Arab Emirates will remain a symbol of tolerance, fraternity and equality, regardless of colour, religion or race said H.E. Sheikh Nahyan bin Mubarak Al Nahyan, Minister of Higher Education & Scientific Research.
